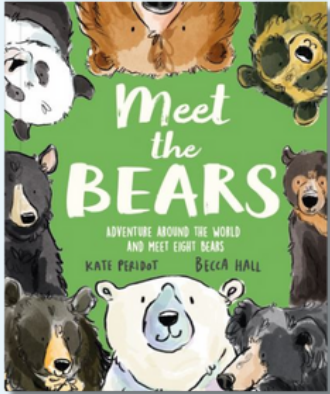

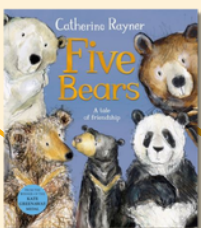

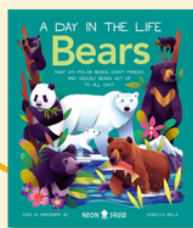
TIME TO TALK

- 7 Which bear do you think you are most like in character, and why?
- 8 Would you like to hibernate? What would be good or bad about this?
- 9 Which type of bear do you like best? What do you like about it?
- 10 The panda has a specially adapted second thumb. If you could have a special feature as part of your body, what would it be and why?

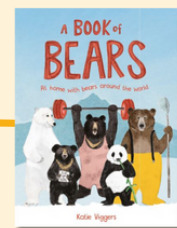
