- What is a coronation?

- What is the role of a monarch?



HISTORY, RE, AND GEOGRAPHY



Research:

Look at a list of key rituals, emblems and symbols used, such as the orb and sceptre.
What do they represent?



Non-fiction writing:

Write a biography of Charles III. This could be as a fact file, or a paragraphed piece. Extra: what are his values?



Compare and contrast:

Watch videos of Elizabeth II's coronation and compare with King Charles III's. What's the same? What's different?





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
Research:

Study the history of Westminster Abbey. Which previous monarchs and notable people have walked through its doors?



Map skills:

Look at a map of London and plot the journey the King will make to his coronation and indicate important landmarks.



Non-fiction writing:

Write a postcard to your family, recounting the day of the Coronation. Extra: design the postcard!



Research:

Make a list of important dignitaries, heads of state, and members of the royal family that who will be invited.


Curriculum Skills


Tie these activities into pupils' skills acquisition relevant to their studied subjects. Examples of skills gained from these activities include:

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ART AND DT




 Study the clothes worn in previous coronations.
